

The Homily

We believe in one God,

The Basics: What You Need to Know

Oregon is a Sanctuary State, which means it is illegal for state and local officials to cooperate with or share information with federal immigration officials without a Judicial Warrant. However, Oregon state or local officials cannot actively prevent federal officials, such as ICE or the National Guard, from carrying out their immigration enforcement duties here.

Despite Oregon's status as a Sanctuary State, community members can still experience Sanctuary Law Violations.
