Gospeler The Holy Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ according to John. **People Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the [authorities], Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

Spring Food Drive Updates - Help Us Combat Hunger!

The recent 17% Federal funding cut-back to the Oregon Food Bank and food banks around the country, is impacting both these organizations and the people who are struggling to find their next meal.

William Temple House

This week, our CCEP Food pantry transferred 391 pounds of food and including 165 pounds of infant formula to the William Temple House Emergency Food Pantry.

Due to the ever-increasing need from local households who depend on assistance, your donations created a very positive infusion to their supplies allowing them to serve others. The William Temple House Food Pantry serves 1500 families a month that include about 2500 members of those households.

Our CCEP Compassion in Action Food Pantry serves three emergency Food Pantries connected with the Oregon Food Bank. As soon as our shelves are filled, we contact one of these food banks for a food transfer. In this case, the William Temple House Food Pantry, like so many other emergency food pantries are constantly resupplying.

Your food donations play a role in helping people to deal with hunger and we thank you for caring!

How You Can Help:

When you are grocery shopping, please pick up some additional items to help continue our support to the emergency food pantries in our area.

We are requesting a variety of canned food products, including canned fruit, soups, beans along with dried goods such as cereal, flour, rice, beans and pasta. Infant formula and products are just as important, serving a critical part of our mission.

Please place your donated canned and dried food items along with infant food products in the Food Pantry basket in the narthex.

Please drop off your bags of food donations in the lobby before each Sunday service or during the week on Mondays - Thursdays between 9-1PM.

Throughout history, immigrant scientists and engineers have made outsized contributions – from developing new technologies to winning Nobel Prizes.

Today, immigrants hold a disproportionate share of patents and intellectual property. One comprehensive study found immigrant inventors produced about 23% of all patents from 1990–2016, far above their 16% share of inventors.

The pipeline of STEM talent would shrink (immigrants make up nearly half of all Ph.D.-level STEM workers), reducing breakthroughs in medicine, tech, and science. The long-term effect could be a decline in U.S. global competitiveness in high-tech industries.

And yet, immigrants represent 1 in 6 people in the US.
