The Lessons

Old Testament

Acts 2:1-21

Lector A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs-- in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?" But others sneered and said, "They are filled with new wine." But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, "Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: 'In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The

sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' "

Proposal for Christ Church Episcopal “Green Team” (working title)

(Note that the following are suggestions and should not be viewed as definitive or limiting for the Team’s activities)

Purpose: To respond to the environmental crises facing God’s Creation; to further Christ Church’s efforts to reduce its carbon footprint; to educate parishioners about their own environmental stewardship and offer options for climate care actions; to enable the congregation to join with others who are already addressing climate change.

Areas of Activity

1. Education

Adult Book Studies focused on climate change Speakers, video series, invitations to local climate action events Discussion groups on current events related to climate policy, new technologies, support for individual efforts to reduce carbon usage Engaging youth and children in education efforts, including faith based principles or responsibility for God's creation

2. Assessment of Christ Church's energy usage

Working with Vestry to arrange professional assessment of heating, lighting, insulation, etc. of the building structure Working with Vestry to discuss any recommended changes or actions

3. Engagement with the Community

Researching and meeting with representatives of religious, governmental and secular groups addressing climate change to discover possibilities of involvement with already effective programs (Oregon Ecumenical Ministries, Oregon Interfaith Power and Light, etc.) Creating community fairs inviting groups active in addressing climate change to set up educational booths, publicizing to local media Developing or engaging with a local interfaith council to create common climate change targeted projects

WEEKLY UPDATE: Infant Formula and the Tualatin Food Pantry

This week we expedited a delivery of 76 pounds of donated infant formula products to the Tualatin Food Pantry. On delivery, they indicated that infant formula products were a high priority and would go out to clients the same day.

Normally, we wait until our shelves are full, but infant products are a priority for food pantries and for their clients who face daily financial challenges.

Once our CCEP Food Pantry shelves are full, we will be sending a shipment of donated food and infant products to the Tualatin Food Pantry.

The Tualatin Food Pantry supports people and families from Tualatin, Tigard, Durham, Lake Oswego, West Linn, and Wilsonville with up to five days of food twice a month. Last year, they served 10,294 households, and with your help, we can continue to support them too.

Your food donations play a role in helping people to deal with hunger and we thank you for caring!

How You Can Help: When you are grocery shopping, please pick up some additional items to help continue our support to the emergency food pantries in our area.

We are requesting a variety of canned food products, including canned fruit, soups, beans along with dried goods such as cereal, flour, rice, beans and pasta. Infant formula and products are just as important and serve a critical part of our mission.

Please place your donated canned and dried food items along with infant food products in the Food Pantry basket in the narthex.

Please drop off your bags of food donations in the lobby before each Sunday service or during the week on Mondays - Thursdays between 9-1PM.

Important: Please check the expiration dates before you donate. The Food Pantries that we support may reject expired food products. If have food that is expired, please dispose of it in a way that is environmentally responsible.

Habitat for Humanity

Announcing a new Re-Store Opening near Bridgeport Village

The 18,500-square-foot Tigard store, located at Building C, 16160 SW Upper Boones Ferry Road, will open to the public in spring 2025.

This new ReStore will be Habitat's fourth store location and sells new and gently used furniture, home decor, appliances, lighting, building materials and more at discounted prices to help fund Habitat's homebuilding and home repair programs in the Portland region, including their latest Lake Grove Project in Lake Oswego.

We could use your help!

Want to help with our newest ReStore? We are looking for volunteers to help us with special projects, store launch, and ongoing support of our new ReStore location in Tigard. If you'd like to be involved.

Generating more than \$5 million each year to support Habitat's homebuilding and home repair programs in the Portland region, the ReStores currently serve more than 44,000 customers and divert over 8,000 tons of reusable materials from Portland landfills annually. The existing ReStores are in Beaverton, Gresham and Portland; customers can also purchase from the ReStores online.

The new location in Tigard also signifies Habitat for Humanity's commitment to supporting the west side of the metro region. Earlier this year, the organization began construction on two Habitat for Humanity developments: a 23-home community in the Lake Grove neighborhood of Lake Oswego and a 16-home community in King City.
