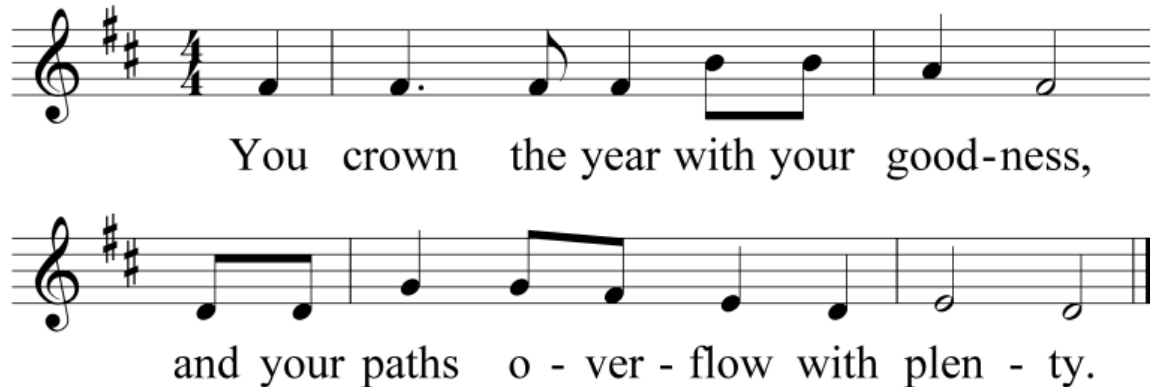

There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do: by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and to deal with sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, so that the just requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit. To set the mind on the flesh is death, but to set the mind on the Spirit is life and peace. For this reason the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law-- indeed it cannot, and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Let anyone with ears listen!"

"Hear then the parable of the sower. As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; yet such a person has no root, but endures only for a while, and when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, that person immediately falls away. As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the lure of wealth choke the word, and it yields nothing. But as for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."

This and That (next meeting Sunday, July 12th)

We began a new pop-up endeavor at Christ Church called *This and That on May 3rd*. It is a small group gathering for exploration, questioning and sharing faith (belief and disbelief). Its origin really goes back to the first years of the Christian movement. When new converts to Christianity were baptized into the faith at the Easter Vigil, they met during a period called *mystagogy* meaning “to experience/be guided through the mysteries” The foundational mystery of Christianity is Easter (the dying-rising event of Christ). Since we are Episcopalians, we will draw especially from our Anglican experience of Christianity or “the Jesus Movement” as it is now commonly called.

This is not a traditional catechesis course. We will explore themes and areas of content as they arise from the group’s interest. It is primarily a sharing and questioning encounter intended for those who are new to Christianity, those coming from different Christian and denominational traditions, and/or those actively searching for spiritual truth, God, or deeper meaning in life. The only requirement is to be one characterized by curiosity, reflection, and a personal quest for understanding.

CCEP Food Pantry Update

As of June 18th, our parish has transferred 1,733 pounds of food to multiple emergency food pantries. Thank you, CCEP Parishioners!

Typically, during the summer months, food donations fall off and your food donations are needed more than ever. The Federal cutbacks and SNAP benefits are definitely impacting people and your help is needed more than ever.

William Temple House will receive our next food transfer as soon as our shelves are once again full. The need has never been greater and once again, we are asking our Parishioners and friends to keep those food donations coming.

Recent Food Transfers:

- 6.18.26 The Tualatin Food Pantry received 438 pounds from your donations
- 6.12.26 Hunger Fighters of Lake Oswego received 138 pounds of canned, dried food products.

How You Can Help:

When you are grocery shopping, please pick up some additional items to help continue our support to the emergency food pantries in our area.

We are requesting a variety of canned food products, including canned fruit, peanut butter, infant formula, soups, beans along with dried goods such as cereal, flour, rice, beans and pasta.

Please place your donated canned and dried food items along with infant food products in the Food Pantry basket in the narthex before each Sunday service or during the week on in the church office Mondays - Fridays between 9-4PM.

American Red Cross Blood Drives Updates

at Christ Church Episcopal Parish

Our recent blood drive on April 28th resulted in 23 units collected, potentially helping 69 patients. Overall, 570 units have been collected since we started hosting the blood drives averaging 26 units per drive.

Facts:

- Every two seconds, someone in the United States needs blood—whether it's an accident victim, a cancer patient, or someone undergoing surgical procedures.
- Every pint donated can potentially help three patients.

Blood Donations are now more inclusive for the LGBTQ+ community.

Many are now able to donate blood through a new inclusive screening process that expands blood donation eligibility and eliminates questions based on sexual orientation through updated FDA guidelines. The American Red Cross celebrates and recognizes there is more work to be done to make blood donations more inclusive.
